Qualifications

- Must be over 20 years old.
- Must have a passion for sailing instruction, the environment and working with kids.
- Strong background in dinghy racing (including spinnaker and trapeze).
- Minimum 2 years working as a coach/instructor in a sailing program.
- Hold a current US Sailing Level 2 Small Boat Instructor certification at a minimum.
- Hold a current Red Cross CPR/AED/First Aid certification.
- Hold a current State Safe Boating & Personal Watercraft Certificate (NASBLA approved)
- Motorboat driving experience; ability to operate a motorboat in all weather conditions.
- Capable of general boat maintenance.
- Must have strong swimming skills and knowledge of water safety.
- Must have superb communication, leadership and staff management abilities.
- Must possess excellent problem solving skills and an ability to adapt to changing program needs depending on weather, number of students, number of boats, etc.
- Valid US driver's license.

Responsibilities & Expectations

- Must be capable of teaching safety, boat handling, and sailing theory to a diverse group
 of students including children and adults, across all skill levels from beginners to racing
 sailors in dinghies.
- Support the Camp Director in organizing and conducting staff training sessions to ensure comprehensive and effective staff development.
- Assist instructors in creating lesson plans and curriculum, providing feedback when necessary.
- Regularly assess and revise safety action plans as needed.
- Ensure effective syllabus implementation, provide necessary tools and resources, and enforce safety protocols.
- Monitor weather and tides, ensure facility cleanliness and safety, and oversee equipment maintenance.
- Model exemplary behavior, foster a cooperative environment, communicate effectively, and maintain approachability.
- Keep accurate records and manage inventories.
- Work with the Camp Director to manage camper registration.
- Act as a liaison among instructors, parents, and staff, anticipate and address problems, and keep supervisors informed.
- Manage Junior Instructors: training, scheduling, and advising.
- Monitor and report on student progress, and conduct evaluations.
- Manage the Adult Lessons, including the scheduling of staff.
- Schedule all private lessons.
- Assist all staff with daily operations of the sailing center.
- Get out on the water throughout the week to observe and assist staff, especially during heavy program weeks/foul weather to be on-hand for docking, end of the day wrap-up, etc.
